

In 1997 I started my journey with the NHJFC when my son Jack started at the NHJFC in Auskick. Steve Jewell, Life Member was NHJFC President. Ronald McDonald House Hobart was the only charity we supported.

In 1998 Michael Bomford started his journey with the NHJFC when his son Alex joined Jack's u8 team. Back then STJFL roster matches were on Saturdays and Auskick up to u12's trained on Sundays at John Turnbull Oval. Youth teams at the Bike Track. All teams played with 18 on the field. Team equipment was sparse and team jumpers were thick cotton blend with numbers stitched on. There was no food van or kiosk at JTO just an urn and chocolates on a card table, very basic. We had a team in each age group with two u14's. Back then if any girls played footy it was with boys up until u13's. Presentation day was at the Granada Tavern it took about 4 hours and everyone got a trophy and photo. In 1998 the u13's won our first STJFL Premiership.

In 2000 Michael and I joined the NHJFC committee and Sonny Azzopardi, Life Member is our new President. Michael started his tenure as Club Treasurer and worked tirelessly with our Auditor, Peter Ryan, Life Member to get club finances on track. During Sonny's tenure we were given an old caravan from the NHFC and Shane Bowden Life Member restored it for us. This was to be an important source of revenue as our "Snackavan" at JTO. Roster matches were now played on Sundays. Sonny with the committee applied for various State Grants and this enabled the club to purchase more equipment and with the Hobart Little Athletics start the process to develop what is our store and kiosk at JTO. Michael starts his quest to formulate our extensive list of club policies. Presentation days are now at NHFC rooms and trophies are achievement based. I am now on the Board of the STJFL and NHFC as well.

2003 comes along and new President Rob Newitt. Michael and I are still on the committee. The new store and kiosk are still our main focus plus purchasing more equipment for our teams. Rob joins me on the board of the NHFC and the relationship between both clubs is as strong as it has ever been. Rob joins the STJFL Board and he is instrumental during this time in preventing AFL Tas from taking control of youth football from the STJFL.



2005 comes along and I am now club President and Michael is still Treasurer, Construction of kiosk building starts with Shane Bowden, Life member as Project Manager. Many people generously supported the construction of the building however special mention has to be made of former parent, the late Brian Stokely. The NHJFC is now humming along quite nicely.

2007 comes along and Peter Fisher, Life Member is our new President. Michael and I are still here. Kiosk is built and the "Snackavan" is now set up at the Bike Track. Revenue for club is peaking, allowing purchase of more equipment.

2010 comes along and Julie Doran. Life Member is club President. Michael and I are still here. Julie brings an enthusiasm to the NHJFC never seen before which sees the publishing of an annual yearbook and an increase in support to various charities. Sizes of teams is now

modified up to u12's, premiership football is introduced to u12's and we now have girls teams. We now have u18's as TSL does not support underage teams. Youth presentation day is at Elwick Racecourse and Hockey Centre.

2017 comes along and Peter White is club President. Michael and I are still here. The girls roster is increasing in age groups and zoning is starting to have an impact on NHJFC age groups. Team jumpers are modern synthetic fabric and numbers and sponsors' logos are printed on jumpers. 2018 is last year for u18's for time being as TSL will take control in 2019. The bond between NHJFC and NHFC is as strong as ever.

The NHJFC has been a proud leader within the STJFL. Since the formation of the STJFL in 1996 the NHJFC has contributed continually at STJFL Board level. In my opinion the NHJFC is one of the best run junior sporting clubs in Australia. The NHJFC provides boys and girls the opportunity to experience AFL in a fun and safe environment. The NHJFC is proud of its unselfish participation in Community events and its long association with Ronald McDonald House Hobart, NHJFC Committee Members, NHJFC Coaches and NHJFC Volunteers have been recognised with various STJFL and AFL Tas awards. Since 1998 NHJFC teams have won 16 premierships.

It has been a pleasure and an honour for Michael and I to have contributed to the success of the NHJFC over the past 21 years.

#### CULTURAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM 2017: CAPE YORK

An initiative of the Hobart City Demons, in particular Kane Richter and Julie Doran, this trip has become an absolute highlight for all involved.

Day 1: The seven day trip began at Cape York House in Cairns where the boys met Rick Hanlon, House Supervisor, support staff and boys living at the house.

Day 2: A 9 hour trip to Bramwell Station where the boys set up camp and shared stories with local kids learning about the aboriginal culture.

Day 3: A shorter 4 hour drive to the tip of Cape York. Here the boys ran a clinic for the local kids from Bamaga and neighbouring communities.

Day 4: Chris Johnson Cup Day. Lead by playing Coach, Chris Ransom, the boys come away with a win playing against teams from Bamaga, Thursday Island and local school Mount St.Bernard. Heading back to Bramwell Station the boys stopped at Fruit Bat Falls for a much needed swim.



Day 5: The 9 hour trip back to Cairns

Day 6: The boys explored Cairns, going to Crystal Cascade Falls in the morning, some shopping and then a swim in the man-made lagoon in the city.

Day 7: Headed home via Melbourne

The trip was life changing for many of the boys, a once in a lifetime opportunity to experience the indigenous culture first hand.






